DALTON L. TRUAX JR. 2007

Dalton Traux was raised in Arabi on Friscoville Avenue. He attended Holy Cross High School and graduated in 1953. He was a 3 year letterman in football, baseball, and wrestling. Dalton was All Prep and All Legion in baseball, the State Wrestling Heavyweight Champ, and named to the Clarion Herald "Team for All Ages." He also played in the 1952 All-State game. Upon graduation, Dalton attended Tulane University on a football scholarship. He lettered 3 years at Tulane University during the years 1954, 1955, and 1956. In his senior year (1956), he co-captained the football team and received "The Most Outstanding Lineman Award." Dalton graduated from Tulane in 1956 with a B.A. Degree in Earth Science.

Dalton participated in the Senior Bowl game in 1956. The head coach of the Senior Bowl, Paul Brown of the Cleveland Browns, said that Dalton was "the best offensive lineman" he had ever coached in the Senior Bowl. That same year, Dalton also played in the Blue-Gray game. In 1957, he was selected to play in the College All Star game, selected to the 2nd team SEC and received honorable mention All-American.

Following his senior year in 1957, he was drafted in the third round by the Green Bay Packers. Before the start of the season, he was traded to the New York Giants and spent 1957 and part of 1958 with the Giants as a guard playing under Vince Lombardi. He missed the 1959 season due to injuries but joined with the Oakland Raiders for the 1960 season and was the starting left tackle playing on the team with Tom Flores and Jim Otto.

Since the end of his football career, Dalton Truax founded and ran his own Real Estate business for the past 48 years. He is married to Marlene Dauterive and has been for 52 years. They have 3 children, Dalton III, Gisele, and Melissa. They also have 6 grandchildren and 3 great-grandchildren.

TRACK AND FIELD

- » State discus champion in Class 4A
- » First girl in school history to win state discus championship
- » Selected to Louisiana all-state academic track and field team
- » Had second longest discus throw for all classes in state
- » Regional discus champion with record setting throw
- » District discus champion with record throw
- » Set school record of 125 feet, 10 inches
- » Established metro area record for girls' discus (125-10)
- » Selected to all-state and all-metro track & field teams in discus
- » Threw over 120 feet in four different meets
- » Won 13 meets in discus, most in state during the season and most ever in school history by a girl thrower and most ever by a girls' discus thrower in metro area history
- » Set 10 meet records during the season
- » Defeated two other athletes at state meet who threw over 120 feet in strongest competition in more than 20 years
- » Won highly-competitive LSU Invitational and Mobile (AL) Challenge of Champions meets
- » Three year letter winner in track and field including junior year (2006) at Merritt Island High School in Merritt Island, Florida

- » Helped team win district championship
- » District champion in discus for third straight year

- Finished 4th in state Class 4A in discus with personal record of 155-8 as a senior in 2007; as a junior in 2006 at Capitol HS in Baton Rouge won Class 3A state discus championship as well as district and regional discus champion
- » Four-year letterman in track and field as discus thrower
