ANDREW JACKSON CLASS OF '67 & '68 SOFTBALL TEAMS

In the late 1960s in St Bernard Parish, there was a group of teenage girls who had grown up playing indoor ball in SBARD summer leagues and in CYO leagues in Catholic Church parishes. They honed their skills as young teens playing softball with Shirley and Tony Licciardi as coaches. Further experience came as older teens on a team coached by 2 young men, Paul Peake and Jimmy Thriffiley. (Apologies if these names are incorrect. These are 50 plus year old memories). There was no interscholastic sports competition for the girls of St. Bernard Parish except the Louisiana State Rally Softball Tournament. It was pre-Title IX times. In high school, girls played intramurals, which were fiercely contested at local schools. For some girls, their only prior interscholastic experience was the '64-'65 Chalmette High softball team which did not fare well due to last minute coaching changes.

Andrew Jackson High School opened in the '66-'67 school year. AJ was a brand new facility, an all girls public high school without outdoor athletic fields, just a big open lot behind the school building. In the spring of 1967, this group of teenage girls was bound for Baton Rouge to compete in the State Rally softball tournament. They were outfitted in navy blue shorts, little sleeveless cotton blouses without numbers or lettering, tennis shoes and white crew socks! They wore daisies in their pigtails and ponytails. In their final game, they met a team from Baker that was decked out in full baseball gear - shirts with numbers and lettering, knee-length pants, stockings and CLEATS! The AJ girls were terrified! But relying on the years of experience and the skills they had learned from coaches past and present, Ellen Walker, Rose Misuraca and Kathleen Hilbert, AJ prevailed and beat Baker for the title. Controversy ensued. AJ's membership in the LHSAA was questioned and the victory over Baker was vacated. The trophy had to be returned.

The '67 AJ softball team was devastated by the turn of events, but they were proud of their accomplishments and pleased by their ability to succeed at this level of competition. The '68 AJ team, which counted several girls from the previous year's team as members, avenged the '67 controversy by winning again at the State Rally and becoming the state champs. It was the dawning of AJ's reputation as a sports powerhouse. Many athletic successes followed in several different sports for the girls of Andrew Jackson High School, which remained an all girls public high school through 1989.

ANDRE DORSEY 2016 CRYSTAL AWARD

Kennesaw State track and field standout Andre Dorsey, who is a five-time USTFCCCA Second Team All-American and a 16-time ASUN Individual Champion, has become the first Owl to qualify for the U.S. Olympic Trials, announced by United States Track and Field. Dorsey's School-record triple jump of 16.10m (52'10) at the Florida Relays was tied for 10th farthest in the NCAA this outdoor season and was good enough to earn him a spot in the Trials.

"Making the US Trials is a huge honor especially when I can represent my school one last time," Dorsey said. "I get to compete against people I watched growing up. There's no Better feeling than knowing you get the chance to potentially represent your family, school, city, and your country all at one time. I've been blessed throughout my career and I'm just anxious to see what the future holds in this next chapter of my life."

In 2017, the Chalmette native competed in the long jump setting a personal best of 26'1. That mark ranked Andre 3rd best in the U.S.A. and 6th best in the world at the time of the jump. He is working hard for the next Olympic Trials in high jump, long jump and triple jump.

Dorsey recently wrapped up his collegiate competition career holding and a 27-time All-Conference selection. He holds eight school records, and was named ASUN Championship Most Valuable Performer five times. He will also leave KSU having been a part of a senior class that led KSU to eight straight ASUN men's conference championship titles.

- Won the Atlantic Sun Championship in the Javelin (54.8m/179-09 ft.).

- Named Most Valuable Performer of the Atlantic Sun Championship after totaling 36 points
- Dorsey claimed two titles, winning the triple jump (16.04m/52-07.5) and the high jump (2.18m/7-01.75 ft.)
- Also, placed in the long jump, weight throw, and shot put
- Placed first in the triple jump at the Niswonger Invitational with a jump of 15.69m/51-05.5 ft.

- Dorsey placed in the top-seven of five events, which included top-three performances in three events; javelin (1st; 56.07m), high jump (2nd; 2.01m) and triple jump (3rd; 14.35m)
- Was selected as an All Atlantic Sun Conference first team member for the Javelin and all Atlantic Sun Conference second team member for the High Jump along with an All Atlantic Sun Conference third team member for the Triple Jump during the outdoor season
- He was selected as an all Atlantic Sun Conference second team member for the High Jump during the indoor season
- Dorsey had 10 total top-5 finishes for the 2012 season.

MITCHELL ROBINSON 2017 MCDONALD'S ALL-AMERICAN

On March 29, Chalmette High's Mitchell Robinson became only the 21st player from the state of Louisiana 10th from the New Orleans area, to play in the McDonald's All-American Game. Only 24 of the nation's best players get an invite.

Robinson will also play in the Jordan Brand Classic on April 17th. The 5-Star Recruit is ranked 9th in the nation by ESPN. He averaged 27.5 points, 12 rebounds, nearly 7 blocks and 2 steals per game.

Mitchell is listed at 7-foot, 226 pounds. Of course, he's dominant in the post, but the big man can handle the ball and knock down threes.

According to his coach and St. Bernard Sports Hall of Fame Inductee, Butch Stockton, "Mitchell is a very fine person, Mitchell's always the first one in the gym. He's also the last one to leave the gym each day. On weekends, Mitchell will call me and ask if he can get in the gym. I'll open it for him and he'll stay for three or four hours. Even during school days, he always comes at night time and works on his game. He's always willing to work to get better.

Most guys with the God-given attributes Mitchell has would just get by, but not him. And that's the reason McDonald's All-American is just the start for this Chalmette High School senior.

Richard Mocklin, Sr. grew up in the heart of the famous 9th Ward. He was raised by his aunt when his mother passed at a very young age. His older brother Al was the male influence in his life as he grew up and it was he that encouraged Richard to get involved in sports in his preteen and teenage years. In addition to a strict upbringing, "Sports" were the key ingredient in

teaching "Richie" the discipline and work ethic that would make him a good Student, Athlete, Employee, Coach and Mentor. "Coach Dick" was a 35 year resident of the 9th Ward and 31 year resident of St. Bernard Parish. "Dick" Mocklin, Sr. exemplifies "Humanitarian". This is his story.

 3973 "Coach Dick" developed a summer baseball program for 13-17 year olds that could not or did not play American Legion Baseball. The league became so popular that many Legion players requested permission from their high school coaches to play in the new summer league. "Coach Dick" and his volunteer coaching staff held a mock draft of the players to divide teams as equally as possible. He then secured parks, scheduled all games, hired umpires and manually kept all stats on every player. With local sponsors, secured by "Coach Dick", all cost involved, including uniforms, were covered.
- "Coach Dick" formed a very popular Sunday morning adult softball league. Local restaurants and bars sponsored teams and many St Bernard Sports' Figures and Coaches played in the league. One team was coached and sponsored by WRNO radio personality Captain Humble. Along with being an active team member sponsored by the Village Restaurant, "Coach Dick" again scheduled all games and umpires and kept manual stats on every player and every team.
- » These leagues were held every summer well into the late 1980's
- "Coach Dick" retired from coaching in 1995

2016 HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE

Jimmy Smith began writing about sports as a 16-year-old in 1972, with stories published in the weekly St. Bernard News about the St. Bernard Ladies Softball League, Chalmette High School athletic events, and the St. Bernard semi-pro baseball league whose representative, sponsored by Gruns Drugs, won the state championship and participated that year in the National Baseball Congress tournament in Wichita, Kan.

In September 1973, while a senior at Chalmette, Smith began what would become a 42-year career in the business at the city's once-daily paper.

His journalism work has taken him across the country and around the globe, covering some of the world's premier sporting events.

His work has appeared in a number of national publications and magazines, as well as on the syndicated

Newhouse News Service.

He was an incredibly average athlete at Patricia Park in Arabi three blocks from his boyhood home in St. Claude Heights, playing football, basketball and baseball, eventually learning that it was vastly more personally rewarding to write about others' athletic endeavors.
