KURT RODRIGUEZ 2010 ELPHAGE CAILLOUETTE SPECIAL RECOGNITION AWARD

The SBPSHOF instituted the Special Recognition honor in 2008. Elphage Caillouette graduated from Chalmette High in 1974 as a four-sport letter winner in football, basketball, baseball and track and field. He received a football scholarship from Tulane University and started as running back on the freshman team. Elphage was scheduled to start as running back as a sophomore in the fall of 1975. A tragic tubing accident took Caillouette's life on July 11, 1976. The local chapter of the Tulane Athletic Booster Club was renamed in his honor as is Chalmette High's most outstanding senior male athlete each year with the Elphage Caillouette Award.

Kurt Rodriguez becomes the third recipient of the Elphage Caillouette Special Recognition Award. His crowning achievement in his stellar football career may have only recently been recognized. In a vote by former players at Northwestern State University, Kurt was named to NSU's All-Century Team (the top 100 players in school history). He was not only a star on the gridiron, but also in the classroom. Kurt was offered both athletic and academic scholarships to several universities before signing with Northwestern State University in Natchitoches, LA. On August 20, 2004, his life suddenly ended in a tragic accident. Who knows how far this wonderful young man would have gone. Kurt Rodgriguez is the epitome of the Elphage Coillouette Special Recognition Award.



Sammy Frichter, Jr. is the son of the St. Bernard Parish Recreation Department founding father, the late Sammy Frichter, Sr. He is also the brother of our Sports Hall of Fame president, Dr. Bryan P. Frichter. After a stellar high school baseball career at Chalmette and making his impact on the college level at the University of Southern Mississippi as the leading hitter as a sophomore and senior, Frichter was bitten by the coaching bug. At Wallace Community College in Dothan, Alabama, he carved out an outstanding career while molding his players to become major college players, major leaguers, minor leaguers, college and high school coaches. In his 17 year career at Wallace, Frichter's teams won 482 games and six conference championships. He continued his coaching at the high school, American Legion, AAU, Best-Best and Dizzy Dean levels. After 38 years, Sammy Frichter, Jr. is still coaching baseball as well as directing baseball academies and schools.


